

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

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

Report on community outreach programme – A visit to National association for the blind school in Jeevan Bima Nagar on 1st November, 2022.



A community outreach program on "A visit to blind school" was organised by the 5th semester students of the Department of Biotechnology on 1st November, 2022 in association with the National Service Scheme unit, TOCE organization at Jeevan Bima Nagar.

The objectives of the outreachprogramwere to spend quality time with the students in the blind school and interact with them. As a part of our interactions, we were explained the basic signs and signals they follow in order to communicate with others, especially while crossing roads. They also showed us the instruments which volunteers use to show the route maps.

We also got a chance to see all the amazing talents they had, which includes singing, depicting the accurate time and quick mathematical calculations. We were also briefed about their daily routine and the tasks assigned to them of which one of them is,telling them the route map and asking them to go to the shop and come back alone. We were shown the way they walk and check for obstructions. Two of us were asked to try to walk with blind folds same as the way they walk, which clearly showed us that we cannot walk as confidently as they do.

All the students there were graduates of which few are teaching online, few are pursuing higher studies, few learning courses, trying for jobs and few were working. It was so inspiring to see them dream big and achieving their goals. Seeing them climbing the stairs, assembling at the dining area, and doing prayers just showcases their confidence. It will be amazing if all of us have the same level of confidence and positivity.

After the interactions and spending quantitative time with them, food kits, fruits, snacks, and essential kits were distributed to all of them. They all were very happy interacting with us and we were all very satisfied visiting this place as we got a chance to interact with such kind hearted and talented people.


Centre, Bangalore. It began at around 10 am and continued up to 4.30 pm, with a steady stream of donors throughout.

The temple is dedicated to Goddess Kamakhya, who is worshipped as the goddess of fertility, power, and desire. The temple complex comprises several shrines and temples, and is located on the Nilachal Hill, which offers stunning views of the Brahmaputra River and the city below. The temple is also known for its unique architecture and intricate carvings, and is a popular pilgrimage site for devotees from all over India. The annual Ambubachi Mela, a festival celebrating the goddess's fertility, is held at the temple and attracts thousands of devotees every year.

The Muga silk saree

Sualkuchi is a town located in the Kamrup district of the state of Assamin north-eastern India. It is known as the "Silk Village" of Assam, as it is famous for producing exquisite silk textiles. Sualkuchi is situated on the banks of the Brahmaputra River, and its silk industry has been thriving for centuries.

The silk produced in Sualkuchi is known as "Muga silk", which is a unique variety of silk found only in Assam. Muga silk is known for itsdurability and lustrous golden colour, and it is considered one of the finest silks in the world. The silk is produced by silkworms that feed on the leaves of the Som and Soalu trees, which are found only in Assam.

The weavers of Sualkuchi are skilled artisans who use traditional handloom techniques to create beautiful silk fabrics. The town has a rich cultural heritage, and the silk industry has played a significant role in shaping its history and identity. Sualkuchi is also home to several temples and other cultural landmarks, which are popular tourist attractions.

In recent years, the government of Assam has taken several initiatives to promote the silk industry in Sualkuchi and support the livelihoods of the weavers. The town has been designated as a "Silk Mark" village, which ensures that the silk produced here is of the highest quality and authentic. Sualkuchi is a unique and culturally rich town that is an important part of Assam's heritage and identity.

PARAMPARA

As the name suggest Parampara means Traditions. The roots of culture in Assam goes back almost five thousand years when the first wave of humans, the Austroasiatic people reached the Brahmaputra valley. They mixed with the later immigrant Tibeto-Burman and the IndoAryan peoples in prehistoric times. The last wave of migration wasthat of the Tai/Shan who later formed the idea of Assamese culture and its identity. The Ahoms, later on, brought some more Indo-Aryans like the Assamese Brahmins and Ganaks and Assamese Kayasthas to Assam.

Assam the heart of the north eastern part of India that boasts a rich and diverse culture. As a student studying the state, I was fascinated by the people, local cult and culture, Bihu dance, and local cuisine.

The majority of people in Assam are Assamese, who are known for their warm hospitality and welcoming nature. The state has a large number of tribes, each unique in its tradition, culture, dress and exotic way of life.

BIHU:

Bihu is the most important festival in Assam and is celebrated three times a year - in January (Magh Bihu), April (Rongali Bihu), and October (Kati Bihu). It is aharvest festival, and people dance and sing traditional Bihu songs, wear colourful clothes, and enjoy feasts.





LOCAL CUISINE:

Assamese cuisine is known for its simplicity and use of local ingredients. Rice is a staple food, and fish and meat dishes are also popular. Some famous Assamese dishes include fish tenga (sour fish curry), xaak aru bhaji (vegetables and herbs), and pitha (rice cakes).


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


Centre, Bangalore. It began at around 10 am and continued up to 4.30 pm, with a steady stream of donors throughout.
